Strong Network

Employees who enroll will have the freedom to choose a provider who is right for them. They may choose from 84,000 access points, including the largest national network of independent doctors and more than 5,000 participating retail chain locations. For added convenience, 91 percent of VSP Doctors offer early morning, evening and weekend appointments, and 24-hour access to emergency care. Benefits are also available to enrollees who may choose to seek services from an out-of-network provider.
